#### **NUMBERS**

A few years ago we were visiting and American missionary in England. He was a bit discouraged by an article in a leading American Christian publication which had a lead article on leadership. In the article it said, "If you have no followers, you are not a leader." I immediately replied to my friend, "Then Jesus was not a leader, for He lost many in one day by rebuking them for following for the loaves and fishes. He then turned to the disciples and said, 'Will you also go away?'" (John 6:22-71)

#### **GOD BUILDS**

However, we must not forget that David, a great leader in the Old Testament, had not just one sin but two. The one was his adultery with Bathsheba. The other was counting the people. (II Sa 24:10). We tend to overlook the sin of adultery among leaders. We do not even recognize numbering the people to be a sin at all. To number the people opens the door in our thinking to believe that we had something to do with this wonderful church with large numbers. This surely is a thought of pride. The Word of God says, "Except the Lord build the house, they labor in vain that build it:" (Ps 127:1).

### **BUILDING CHARACTER**

#### **GREAT LEADERS**
