WHEN REVIVAL COMES

WE SPEND TIME WITH GOD

When revival comes, we want to spend even more time in the presence of God. I heard a story about the great Hebrides revival. Un-churched farmers in the fields had the Holy Ghost fall on them. They dropped their tools and ran to church. They got there before the pastor and it was not even a scheduled meeting night. They knew it was God. They instantly were hungry to spend more time with Him. During the Charismatic move, people would go house to house to drink a cup of coffee and talk about Jesus (even though they had not read the book of Acts or signed up for a house group).

GO BUTTONS ARE TOUCHED

When revival comes, your "go button" will be touched. Forget about Bible School (I am not against Bible Schools), there is not time for that, we think. We just want to go and tell. We have such a desire to share the touch of God in our lives, that we are willing to sell all to follow Him.

WALLETS ARE EMPTIED

When revival comes, our hearts will be so touched by God that we want to give. We forget about 10%. We are willing to give all that we have in appreciation of the touch of God in our lives.

DO WE REALLY WANT REVIVAL?

Knowing what will happen when God touches, we must ask ourselves, "Do we really want revival?" Do we want to be labeled emotionalists? Do we want to be called radicals? Do we want to be seen as irrational? When true revival comes from God, all of these questions will answer themselves.
